

## Level 2 Mandatory Water Use Restrictions End

---

The Vista Irrigation District has declared an end to Level 2 conditions and returned to Level 1. The move was made in response to Governor Newsom terminating a requirement that all urban water suppliers implement Level 2 of their Water Shortage Contingency Plans. The return to Level 1 is effective immediately.

The Level 2 condition included mandatory water use restrictions including limiting landscape watering to 3 assigned days per week and 10 minutes per sprinkler station. These restrictions are no longer in effect with the return to Level 1. However, mandatory water-use efficiency practices, such as watering landscape in the early morning and evening hours, eliminating run-off, not using water to wash down paved surfaces and repairing leaks in a timely manner, remain in place with the return to Level 1.

The District would like to thank its customers for their conservation efforts during California's historic multi-year drought. Although the District has ended Level 2 mandatory water use restrictions, the District asks its customers to continue to use water wisely, as water use efficiency plays an essential role in helping the District manage its water supplies.

### Level 1 Water Use Efficiency Practices

- Residents, businesses and nurseries/commercial growers water before 8 a.m. and after 6 p.m.
- Hand watering is permitted at anytime.
- No watering landscapes during or 48 hours after it rains.
- No washing down of paved surfaces except for health and safety purposes.
- Eliminate water waste resulting from inefficient landscape irrigation and run-off.
- Wash vehicles with a bucket or a hand-held hose with positive shut-off nozzle.
- Serve/refill water in restaurants only upon request.
- Offer guests in hotels/motels the option of not laundering towels and linens daily.
- Repair all water leaks within 48 hours.

*Please note that the State's prohibition of irrigating non-functional turf (e.g. solely ornamental and not used for recreational or civic/community purposes) remains in effect at commercial, industrial and institutional sites. Watering these areas to protect the health of trees and shrubs is permitted.*
